The Transportation Research Board (TRB) 92nd Annual Meeting will be held in Washington, D.C. at the Washington Marriott Wardman Park, Omni Shoreham, and Washington Hilton hotels. The Conference attracts more than 11,000 transportation professionals from around the world to Washington, D.C., January 13-17, 2013.

The TRB Annual Meeting program covers all transportation modes, with more than 4,000 presentations in nearly 750 sessions and workshops addressing topics of interest to all attendees—policy makers, administrators, practitioners, researchers, and representatives of government, industry, and academic institutions. More than 40 sessions and workshops will address the spotlight theme for 2013: **Deploying Transportation Research - Doing Things Smarter, Better, Faster.**

TRB Annual Meeting is a major Conference for the ECTRI Members, which are actively involved. More than 50 scientists from 12 ECTRI Institutes or Universities (DLR, DVS, HIT, Ifsttar, POLITO, TRL, UPM, DTU, CDV, VTI, CENIT, and TOI) are currently members of 45 TRB Committees where they share their expertise and contribute to advancing the state of the art and the state of the practice in transportation.

In 2006, ECTRI and TRB, both representing a substantial part of the transport research community in their respective regions, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding with objective to foster and facilitate greater synergies for information-sharing and cooperation between the two organisations. This MoU is implemented by 2-year action plan organising a number of joint activities.

This year again, in the frame of this MoU, ECTRI has contributed by organising a number of sessions and giving a European flavour to the Annual Meeting. With the event approaching, Prof. George Giannopoulos, new elected ECTRI Chair and ECTRI-TRB MoU Moderator, and Caroline Alméras, ECTRI Secretary-General, would like to highlight these sessions where a number of ECTRI members will be participating.
